



Museum Planning Meeting Sets Short Term Goals

On March 26, 2011, the Long-Range Planning Committee met with RCT&HS Board members, committee chairs, and other interested members to discuss and reach a consensus on short-term and long-term needs for the Reading Railroad Heritage Museum (RRHM). Approximately 25 people attended. Several potential projects were identified and participants agreed that we need to look into funding and fund raising options as well. The top seven projects are (1) electricity/power issues, (2) roof repair and assessment, (3) site safety and security, (4) rolling stock stabilization and work shop, (5) track building, (6) secure windows and façade (Foundry Building), and (7) plan for museum expansion.

Eight work groups were established to further explore and define the 7 projects and to explore options for funding and fund raising. The following members agreed to serve on the eight work groups:

- 1. Electricity/power issues: Rich Tobin (chair), John Corbett, Jonathan Barket, John Stoudt, Mike Stehman
- 2. Roof repair and assessment: John Corbett, Duane Engle
- 3. Site safety and security: Don Crabtree (chair), Jim Adams, Tom Brown, Mike Stehman, Duane Briscoe
- 4. Rolling stock stabilization and work shop: Rich Tobin, John Corbett, Jonathan Barket, John Stoudt, Mike Stehman
- 5. Build track: Duane Engle and the track gang
- 6. Secure windows and façade: Steve Gilbert (additional volunteers are needed)
- 7. Plan for museum expansion: Carol Adams, Tom Brown Fund raising: Jim Blake, Paul Troutman, John Brown, Mike Stehman, Duane Briscoe, Jonathan Barket

Each of the work groups will meet to define its project, including assessing what needs to be done and identifying potential problems/obstacles, permits/approvals needed, need for consultants, work to be done by contractors/ work to be done by volunteers, estimate volunteer labor hours and project costs, and identify potential funding sources. The fund raising group will explore funding and fund raising options for the Society. Each work group will prepare a written report to the Board of Directors for further consideration.



Master Calendar Announcement



We continue to urge the RCT&HS to develop a master calendar. There will be a Girl Scout Tour Wednesday March 23rd at 6:30PM. Dale and Tom Brown will host. John Brown will represent the Ops Committee at the RCT&HS planning session March 28th. Mike Stehman will install a closed circuit TV surveillance system. After much discussion about the condition of our HO scale modular layout we came to the conclusion that it be retained as a modular set up and fixed up. Two sections may be removed to allow more exhibit space. It was mentioned that the inside space could be used for a narrow display board with photos or other visual displays. A suggestion for an O scale layout was dismissed as it would take up too much space. We have a church group tour Tuesday April 5, 2011 at 10AM. We have been contacted regarding a tour for 65 kindergarten children from the Hamburg School District. We welcome Tom Poserina as a new docent. We discussed construction work being done at the museum while visitors are present. We recognize the dilemma since our workers are volunteers weekends may be the only time they can work at the museum. After having received some complaints from visitors the committee decided that all future construction not be done during the hours the museum I open to the public. If this means the project will take longer to complete, so be it. In relation to that we placed getting electricity to the finishing building first on our list of priorities to the board. This will allow museum work to be done there. Dale has been giving out our rack cards at presentations he has done in Audubon (Road Scholars), Reading (Berks Genealogical Society) and Trooper (Lower Providence Presbyterian Church) resulting in groups signing up to visit the museum. The Reading Specialist for The Muhlenberg School District Elementary Center has contacted us about working with the school using our theme of Reading on the Reading. More information will be presented as we get into this project. Dale is looking into whether we should join the Association of Railroad Museums. We can have a table at Hamburg's Hamburger Festival September 3rd if we can get volunteers (same day as Scranton Railfest) We discussed covering the Penn Steel sign over the entrance door with a sign that says Entrance.

Don Davis reported dropping off the latest bundle of Redners tapes which provided \$46 worth of revenue for the RCT&HS. Keep those tapes coming!


New Business
